Challenges

State of affairs

Politicizing of city planning and clash of interest

 Legacy of centralised planning approaches from the Communist era

Impacts

- Severe economic impacts
- Sectoral based, rigid and fragmented strategic planning system
- Unsystematic and inefficient city investments
- Slow processes, lack of rules and instability







Key Problems

Path Dependencies

 Traditional tools for building of cities eliminated – emphasis on central planning (of settlements)

- Function over urbanism: Overlooking the character of specific localities, decline of heterogeneity and distinctiveness
- Creation of separated islands of buildings instead of a compact city


